

Geography this term is "Where does our energy come from?" focusing on helping the children understand the sources of energy, how energy is used, and the impact of different energy sources on the environment. The unit encourages a holistic understanding of energy in modern life and prepares students to think critically about the future of energy use and conservation.

In Science, we will be learning about Evolution and Inheritance in the first half term; recognising that living things have changed over time and that fossils can provide information about them. In the second half term, pupils will be describing the changes as humans develop to old age. This will have strong cross-curricular links with the PSHE topic about puberty.

In History, we will be answering the question: What role did children play during the Industrial Revolution? This subject will involve a history workshop, which we look forward to!

In PHSE children will consider ways they can use the internet positively and how they can look after their wellbeing while being online. Children will learn about potential risks of being online and when using digital technologies as well as strategies to stay safe and to get help. They will also learn about online relationships and what a respectful and healthy online relationship looks like, as well as signs of an inappropriate online relationship and ways to get help. The bene fits and risk of social media will also be explored, as well as how social media can be used responsibly. Children will also learn how to recognise what online bullying looks like and how to help make it stop.

In R.E. our next units are 'Creation and Science — Conflict and Complementary' and 'What difference does the Resurrection make to Christians? With a focus on the significance of Easter.

The focus of the DT unit is Electrical systems: Doodlers. The children will be investigating an existing motorised product and problem-solving to understand its construction before developing their own.



In Art we will be using our observational skills to represent wildlife using different media and will complete an Artist Study on Hundertwasser.

In French we will be covering 'Do You Have a Pet?' and 'What is the weather?'.

In Computing lessons, we will have the opportunity to learn how to create short videos in groups. As they progress through this unit, they will be exposed to topic-based language and develop the skills of capturing, editing, and manipulating video, before looking at how a flat-file database can be used to organise data in

records. Online safety will continue to be a focus, please discuss this with your child especially if you allow them to go online with social media including games and conversations.

In Literacy, we will be reading texts/watching clips that involve stories by famous authors, non-fiction and a variety of narrative texts, including poetry. This term, our class text is the wonderful *The Boy Who Sailed the Ocean in an Armchair*.

Please help your child by:

- Encouraging them to read as often as possible and remember our expectations: at least three times a week with reading recorded and diaries signed.
- Discussing their reading to ensure understanding.
- To practise the spellings with them.

In Maths we will be covering all areas of the Maths curriculum through the White Rose maths scheme. It is important that the children practise their tables at home. Please help your child by:

- Encouraging them to practise their tables and the corresponding division facts. Children, by Yr5, should know all the tables.
- Taking opportunities to use and apply maths in everyday situations e.g. cooking, shopping and telling the time.
- Helping them complete any homework.

Plain black or navy shorts (No logos). These are required for all indoor PE lessons. Shorts should be of an appropriate length.
