Literacy/Kinetic letters This half term we will move towards more regular, formal writing sessions, where we will be supporting the children to start writing in sentences. We will teach them about finger spaces, full stops, and capital letter use. Kinetic letters handwriting will focus on the rest of the lowercase letters first. Then we will move on to uppercase letter formation and number formation. Please practise handwriting at home where you can! Key texts: The Train Ride, Duck in a Truck, Little people big dreams – Amelia Earhart, Emma Jane's aeroplane, Mr Gumpy's outing. As well as non-fiction books about transport/vehicles. Mathematics Please keep an eye on the Talk Newsletter, which we post weekly on ClassDojo. This will tell you what we have been doing in our maths sessions for that week. Some of the topics we will be covering are composition of numbers, subitizing, comparing mass and capacity, exploring 6,7, & 8 in depth, odd and even numbers, doubles and combining groups.
<b>Expressive Arts &amp; Design</b> This half term we will be holding a CNY art and design workshop, more information to follow regarding when you can come and get involved! We will learn about folk art that is seen on narrowboats and paint our own designs. We will also continue with our music sessions, using instruments to explore and engage in music making. Daily poetry and rhyme sessions will continue, and we will also be performing rhymes as part of our PE unit.	TRANSPORT	Understanding the World Our exciting new role-play area will be a car garage, where the children can develop their pretend play being a mechanic! During our learning about water transport, we will investigate floating and sinking and develop our scientific prediction enquiry skills. We will observe the weather changing and talk about appropriate ways to dress in cold weather, as part of our understanding of the world. We will also find out about Chinese New Year festivities!
Communication & Language Our 'word ninja' word of the day will focus on words linked to our transport topic. Please see these on the talk newsletter each week. Listening to and talking about non-fiction texts will help the children develop their knowledge and vocabulary too. We will also be asking the children to offer explanations about why things happen, expressing their ideas using full sentences. Personal, Social and Emotional Development	Our topic this half term is 'Transport'. We will spend the next few weeks learning about different types of travel including road, train, air and water transport. We will compare transport in the past and present, as well as making our own predictions about the transport of the future! We will learn about steam trains and their uses, life on a narrowboat and the purpose of canals.
