

Reception Class Newsletter

Parents were invited to an EYFS and a Phonics workshop and enjoyed watching the Reception children perform brilliantly in their first assembly.

After half term Reception class will have a busy time ahead learning all about festivals and celebrations. We will begin the half term learning about bonfire night and Diwali. We will then learn about light and dark and look forward to a visit from the road safety officer.

Reading and Phonics

All children need to bring their book bag containing their reading book, reading diary and phonics folder on a daily basis. Please <u>do not</u> place water bottles in book bags as they often leak. Please try to share a book with your child everyday (10 minutes is great) and write comments in their diary, as this is vital for their progression.

Reading books will be issued during the course of next half term when your child is working securely within phase 2 of the Letters and Sounds programme. Information about your child's progress will be shared at parents evening. Phonics folders will be collected in on Thursdays to allow staff to read parent comments and update folders ready to be given out on Fridays.

Diwali

Diwali is celebrated by Hindus in India and all around the world in October or November. It is a very exciting and colourful holiday. Homes are cleaned to welcome the New Year and windows are opened so that the Hindu goddess of wealth, Lakshmi, can enter. It is believed that she cannot enter a house which is not lit up, so every household burns special Diwali clay lamps (diyas) to light the way for the goddess, which is why the holiday is also known as the Festival of Lights. Children have a holiday from school. Presents are given and delicious holiday food is prepared and exchanged. New clothes and jewellery are worn. Parties are held, and dice and card games are played. Fireworks and firecrackers are set off to warn off evil spirits, so it is a noisy holiday too!
